



**A RESOLUTION MEMORIALIZING  
THE LATE FRANK EMERSON BEVERLY, SR.**

**WHEREAS**, when Mr. Beverly departed this life on Tuesday, the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of November, 2004, the president of the Roanoke Bar Association wished to recognize the achievements of Mr. Beverly.

**WHEREAS**, Mr. Beverly was born in Jenkins, Kentucky, on August 12, 1921, to the late William Monroe Beverly and Cora Owens Beverly.

**WHEREAS**, Mr. Beverly received his law degree from W&L University where he was a member of Phi Beta Kappa, Order of The Coif and editor of the W&L Law Review. Mr. Beverly was a member of the Virginia State Bar Association. Mr. Beverly practiced law in Dickinson County, Virginia until 1968. After that, Mr. Beverly moved to Roanoke, Virginia, where he practiced law until his retirement in 1977.

**WHEREAS**, upon his retirement, Mr. Beverly and his beloved wife of 57 years, Pauline, moved to Smith Mountain Lake. Mr. Beverly wanted to move to the country where he could fish and enjoy the outdoors.

**WHEREAS**, Mr. Beverly was a United States Army Air Force Veteran and proudly served his country during World War II.

**WHEREAS**, Mr. Beverly is survived by a son, Frank E. Beverly, Jr. and his wife Carolyn, by two daughters, Barbara B. Evans and her husband Thor, and Lorna Shaw and her husband David, by two brothers, Eugene G. Beverly and his wife Ruby, and William B. Beverly and his wife Susan, by a sister-in-law Joyce P. Beverly, by four grandchildren and one great grandchild.
